

From the Presbyter's Desk

Abiding and Bearing Fruit

"....Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit..."

(John 15:5)

Lent is a season of reflection, repentance, reconciliation and renewal. It is a time of new beginnings and new relationships with God, neighbour and self, in and through Jesus Christ. Our reflections each year invites us to focus on a theme, idea or metaphor, helping us to draw closer in our relationship with Christ. This year, let us begin and continue our journey with one of the most profound and unique themes in the New Testament, "Abiding and Bearing Fruit," as illustrated in John 15:1-11. The metaphor of the Vine and the branches are beautifully illustrated in the Gospel of John.

Vine is a common metaphor for Israel in the Hebrew Bible, with God in the role as the vinedresser disappointed with the fruit (Psalm 80:8-16; Isaiah 5:1-7; Jeremiah 2:21).

Thinking of a story from, Stories for All Seasons by Gerard Fuller:

A missionary in Africa lived in his central mission which had a small electric plant to supply current for his church and small rectory. Some natives from an outlying mission came to visit the Padre. They noticed the electric light hanging from the ceiling of his living room. They watched wide-eyed as he turned the little switch and the light came on. One of the visitors asked if he could have one of those bulbs. The priest, thinking he wanted it for a sort of trinket or bauble, gave him a burned-out bulb. On his next visit to the outlying mission, the priest stopped at the hut of the man who had asked for the bulb. Imagine the priest's surprise when he saw the bulb hanging from an ordinary string. He had to explain that one had to have electricity and a wire to bring the current to the bulb.

One of the greatest teachings of Jesus, taught, demonstrated and lived out, is the story of *Discipleship*. For John, to abide in Christ, is the starting point of all other experiences in Christ and is a call to discipleship. We are called to *abide in Jesus*, the Vine. In Greek, the meaning of "abide," is a command. It is also an ongoing process and the command to "abide," which is not fulfilled in a single act. Discipleship is an ongoing process and abiding is a moment-by-moment decision to follow Christ. The result is that a disciple will bear 'more fruit' (15:2)

and 'much fruit' (15:8), and by abiding and bearing fruit, will become Disciples of Christ (15:8).

Our theme this year invites us to reflect on the different aspects of Christ, but let us begin this season by abiding in Christ and set goals of bearing fruit. The Apostle Paul echoes similar ideas in *Galatians 5:22-23*, of the "Fruit of the Spirit," and explains the *nine fruits of the Spirit*.

We look forward to a *meaningful time of Lent*, even as the ministries begin to slowly get back to the regular programmes, fellowship and study.

As announced, the work of providing additional facilities on St. Andrews's Church Parish Hall and Resource Centre, up-gradation on the Diocesan website and PA system, are in progress.

We thank you for your continued prayers and support.

May God bless you, and may you have a meaningful Season of Lent.

Confirmation Sunday

"If we live, we live to the Lord; and if we die, we die to the Lord. So, whether we live or die, we belong to the Lord" Romans 14:8

26 young men and women declared their commitment on January 8, 2023 in St. Andrew's Church. The parents, relatives and the entire congregation in addition to all well-wishers who were participating in the Worship Service would have been also reminded of their own commitments made years ago.

The Rt. Rev. Dr. P. K. Samuel, Bishop, Karnataka Central Diocese, confirmed and blessed the candidates. He had also met the Candidates for a brief interaction before the Confirmation Service. The candidates carried the Bible for the procession, and read the Scriptures as is the tradition at St. Andrew's. The Bishop's Sermon on this special Sunday was based on the theme 'Blessed and Fruitful Life'. The Confirmation Service also included the Holy Eucharist Service, and the candidates along with their parents were the first to participate in the Holy Communion.



The young men and women had been prepared for this commitment for more than three months by our Presbyter, *Rev. Dr. Dexter S. Maben.* The students used to meet every Saturday for classes, which included foundational themes of *Faith, Doctrine* and *Life.*

In addition to the classes, they also took up *Projects* as small groups on specific topics in the Bible, and presented it to an audience consisting of the parents and a few senior members. The Themes revolved around the Old Testament themes, Life of Jesus Christ, and History of the Church. The amount of preparation done by the students and the depth they had gone into was evident in the presentations, which were very well appreciated by those who attended the presentations. The Parents participated in all the Sessions enthusiastically and cooperated in all the preparations. The final presentation was followed by the Preparatory *Time for the Worship Service*, including the rehearsal. A day-long *Retreat* had been organized at *Visthar Convention Center* where the resource persons *Rev. Dr. David Selvaraj* and *Rev. Dr. Rohan Gideon* guided the Confirmation Students and prepared them with commitment to Christ.

We thank God for the grace we received in conducting the Confirmation Service and thank everyone who made it possible.

While medication helps cure the illness, it is often wished that the prescription also includes compassion, deep listening and connection from the Caregiver. Listed below are 12 helpful hints from Alzheimer Scotland, on communicating with someone who has Dementia:

- •Be calm and patient.
- Face the person, speak clearly and slowly.
- Make sure that you have their attention by saying their name.
- •Use short, simple sentences and say exactly what you mean.
- •Try to get one idea across at a time.
- Allow plenty of time for the person to take in what you say and to reply.
- •Try not to confuse or embarrass the person by correcting them bluntly.
- •Use questions which ask for a simple answer.
- •Don't ask questions which test their memory e.g. What did you do yesterday?
- Talk about familiar people, places and ideas.
- •Use the names of the people you are talking about instead of "he" or "she".
- It will remind the person who you are talking about.
- •Use facial expressions and hand gestures to make yourself understood.


