

From the Presbyter's Desk

Prioritizing and Empowering Justice

"But Strive first for the Kingdom of God..."

Matthew 6:33

Priority about priorities is a matter of priority. We have to constantly set and reset our priorities based on our convictions, experiences and plans. Jesus as a creative and radical Teacher whose teaching in the Gospel of Matthew with its five discourses, including the Sermon on the Mount, forms the core of Christian and Theological Education. This month we prepare to focus on the teaching, training and formation of Pastors and Christian teachers or in other words, on *Theological Education* and *Ministerial Formation*. We are covering several images and aspects of ministry. We are also focussing on couples and family life.

Our Lord said, "But strive first for the Kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well." (Matthew 6:33). Righteousness can also be translated as Justice. Probably, as in many places in the New Testament, Justice would have been more appropriate and better received in our context. Today, what is probably missing is the "Consciousness of Justice," in our Theological Education. The Church of South India Almanac indicates the theme as 'Equipping the People of God.' But we need a shift from Equipping to Empowering, because prioritizing Justice is all about empowering Justice.

In a related passage in *Matthew 10:40-42, in v.41* it is pointed, "Whoever welcomes a prophet in the name of a prophet will receive a prophet's reward; and whoever welcomes a righteous person in the name of a righteous person will receive the reward of the righteous" (Matt. 10: 41). So, the reward of Righteousness or Justice cannot be received but needs to be shared and celebrated.

Theological Education cannot remain an abstract, elite intellectual exercise, but must result from the articulation from the margins and in the transformation of margins. The reference to the "little ones" (Matthew 10: 42) is a reference to the consciousness of the people in the margins. The

teaching and discipleship of Jesus is radical because it did not begin with institutional support, political patronage or social status, and the result was that the Apostles went into the world as vulnerable strangers and messengers without earthly power, but in the power of the Holy Spirit. The task of Theological Education is to prioritize Justice, which would mean engagement with institutional power, social hierarchy and political patronage. Visions of empowerment are not realized because we are constantly failing to prioritize and engage with Justice in our thinking, formation, and action. Theological Education is a work that requires partnership between formal centers of Theological Education and the Church, which would help discover together patterns and pathways in prioritizing and empowering Justice. Glad that we are blessed with the ministry and engagement of Theological Educators and Students in our local church ministry.

Along with the focus on Theological Education, the *Young Couples Fellowship* (YCF) is planning for a major program to invite and help couples to renew and revitalize their family lives. In addition, they will be assisting in *pre-marital sessions* at the church. Even as our families are under pressure, it is our hope that YCF will provide adequate spaces for families to flourish with God's love.

Our work to support students with *general scholarships* has been a great sign of encouragement and we hope that your giving to support this initiative during the month of July will be rewarding.

We are happy to welcome *Mrs. Sudha* as the new *Headmistress* of our St. Andrew's School, and we thank *Mrs. Saraswathi* for her services and the leadership provided at a challenging time during the pandemic.

As we sip our Coffee every Sunday, I am sure we miss *Mr. Krishna* who served as *Sexton*. He had to seek voluntary retirement due to personal and medical reasons. We miss him and the fellowship with the family on the campus and sincerely remember him for his services.

WOMEN'S FELLOWSHIP

'May the Grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the Love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all.' 2 Corinthians 13:14

Our Women's Fellowship met on *Saturday, the 3rd of June* for their monthly *Bible Study*. The Bible Study was conducted by *Mrs. Veneetha Sunita.*

We looked at the 3 important events, the Resurrection and the Ascension of our Lord Jesus, and the Gift of the Holy Spirit. As we worked our way to the first 5 Books of the New Testament, we tried to understand the significance of these 3 stages.

We focused on certain aspects of these historical events. Why did Jesus choose to appear before some individuals? How did that change them? What did Jesus do during the *40 days* from *Resurrection* to *Ascension*, was another significant part of the Study. What was the purpose of asking the disciples to stay together and remain in Jerusalem?

Visualizing the *Ascension* as described in *Mark 16: 19, Luke 24: 50-51, Acts 1:9-11,* and then analyzing the multiple roles and powers that were bestowed on Christ Jesus as accounted in the Epistles, helped us understand how *Jesus seated at the right hand of the Father* is our advocate constantly interceding for us personally, calling us by name with love and understanding.

What did the disciples do during the 10 days between Ascension and Pentecost? We also used the following Biblical references from Acts 2:1-4, 4:27–31, 8:15 - 17, 10:44, 11:15,16, and Acts 19:6, to see for ourselves that the pouring in of the Holy Spirit was essentially when the disciples and believers were together in fellowship.

Why should we celebrate *Ascension* with fervour? Are we in a state of preparedness for the *Second Coming of our Lord Jesus?* Do we seek for opportunities to be in fellowship with fellow believers? Each one of us was challenged to reflect on these and the many questions that the *Holy Spirit* brings to mind as we meditate on the *Word of God*.





On the 17th of June, Candle Making Session was conducted by Mrs. Mirium Sadhu, where we learnt to make beautiful candles. It was a wonderful time of learning this beautiful art. We are grateful to God for all these experiences and opportunities He is giving to all of us.

5 Case Studies brought out various key points highlighted below. Every couple shared their perspective and understanding:

- A clear communication between the couples to be married is a must and crucial part before the big day! It's always good to talk and sort out little or trivial matters before committing.
- After marriage, the communication is a totally different ball game altogether! Adapting to it is the key to a happy marriage.



- Getting help from able Counselors anytime when either of the spouses requires assistance in marriage is a must. There is a taboo associated with Mental Health, and yes, we need to accept things and find solution to it instead of brooding over it; just like the way we go to the doctors for our physical health checks!
- A simple theory of *leave and cleave* highlighted in *Genesis 2:24*, was shared. This is a trivial matter where one/both spouses are unable/unaware of prioritizing their spouse over their parents. It's magic in the family when both spouses *understand* this concept and *both treat each other's parents with love and respect!*
- Handling *children's psychological wellbeing* especially during conflicts between the spouses is a very crucial part of a family life.
- Forgive just like Christ.
- A family could run smoothly only if there is a dedicated *Family Altar-time*, which is just like cherry on top of the cake in a *Christ-centered* family!


