From the Presbyter's Desk

Embracing Empowerment

"Let us go across to the other side"

Mark 4:35

Isidore Robey, a famous Physicist, came to the United States as a small child and grew up on New York City's Lower East side. In an interview he was once asked how a poor immigrant boy was able to become one of the world's leading physicists. He replied, "I couldn't help it. It was because of my mother. She had a deep appreciation for the search for the truth. And every single day when I came home from school, she would ask me, 'Did you ask any good question today?'"

In the month of September, we prepare to celebrate *Education, Women* and the *Elderly.* The story of Isidore Robey, in a way combines all three important areas of our life into conversation. One thing stands out is the idea of "*Empowerment*," and the need to embrace empowerment. The cry for *Equality, Justice*, and *Freedom* gets louder each day, even as we celebrate growing images of modernity and technology. We are wondering how *Artificial Intelligence* (AI) is going to shape our lives, our jobs and even our thinking. It is in this context, that we find that the teachings of Jesus were radical and contemporary.

In the Gospel of *Mark 4:35-41*, the call of Jesus "Let us go across to the other side," as a Teacher, was a radical call of courageous learning and open engagement. Jesus wanted to teach lessons of life that are grounded on values and choices. Jesus was willing to go away from the crowd, from the stage, from publicity, from attention to teach lessons of faith to the disciples. Jesus believed in the philosophy of learning by doing, theoretical learning but result in practical living. He taught the disciples that they cannot hide in the crowd, they need to face the storm, and they need to face challenges. We are not alone, but the promise of the presence is real, 'Peace! Be still' (4:39), is real and a promise beyond assurance. Questions are part of learning, as the disciples asked, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" (Mark 4:38). We must continue to ask questions, only then we will find answers. Sometimes

when we ask, people in authority or in positions of power feel uncomfortable, but we must continue to ask, even as we ask ourselves.

We are deeply grateful to God that our ministry of *Christian Education* in our *Sunday School* and our ministry of embracing empowerment is carried out at *St. Andrew's School at Siddapura*.

It is a matter of joy that our *Women* are meeting regularly for *Bible Study* and *Fellowship*, and extending *hospitality* to people in need.

Our regular meeting of the *Care for the Elderly* ministry has been rewarding, and it is matter of joy that deep bonds are being built and encouragement is flourishing.

We continue to thank God for the *Team Leadership* and the work of *networking* continues to be blessed.

Let us embrace empowerment in our different areas of life and work.

'Not only so, but we also glory in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope. And hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us.'

Romans 5:3-5

We often think why we go through the things we go through and tie it up with our own understanding, missing out on what God intended for us.

The passage that we studied was 1 Kings 17:1-9, from which we drew 3 main takeaways that we could reflect upon:

i. Just as God safely kept Elijah in the cave away from King Ahab, we can be sure that when God calls us for a purpose, He *PROTECTS* us and makes a path for us to carry it out.

- ii. Next, we saw how God miraculously *PROVIDES* for Elijah with bread from ravens and water from the brook. God already knows our spoken and unspoken needs and will always make sure his children are equipped for the task He calls them for. We must trust in that our needs can be met through Him and we can depend on God in everything.
- iii. Finally, as we journeyed with Elijah, as the brook dried up and his time in isolation was nearly done, the frustration of not knowing what was coming next and the anxiety must have built up as we all go through that in our own life. We feel anxious when we are not in control of our situations, but here we learn as the story unfurls that God has a specific plan for Elijah to further his ministry from Zerephath after encountering a widow there. Unless he went through all that he did, he wouldn't have been strong enough to endure the major part of his mission as an ambassador for the Lord of Israel. God intends to PRESERVE us for His perfect will in our life, and the only way we can see it through is if we submit our lives to God and let him take control.

Everything we go through has God's hand in it and He doesn't put us through more than we can bear. We are transformed by our experiences in order that we can serve others better as God's children. Through all this, we know we can hold on to the hope, keep our eyes on Jesus and depend on Him to Protect us, Provide for us and Preserve us for His great plan in our life.

The Bible Study was conducted by Mrs. Neha Soans George on Saturday, the 5th of August, 2023. We are very grateful and thank Neha for conducting the above Bible Study.

This insightful session left participants inspired to imbue their own lives with purposeful actions and values reflective of Christ's teachings.
