Fearless Hope

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From the Presbyterian's Desk

Fearless Hope

"...Now hope that is seen is not hope" Romans 8:24

The shift of our meditations and ministry of the Word from *Good Friday* to *Easter* is one from 'Fear to Hope', and *Easter* is the celebration of "Fearless Hope." One of the lasting images surrounding our Good Friday meditations is the vulnerability of Jesus on the Cross and the celebration of love that overcomes fear and hatred. But the image is not complete without grappling with the reality that crowds around the cross stood helpless and "returned home, beating their breasts. And all his acquaintances... stood at a distance watching these things" (Luke 23:48-49). Authoritarianism coupled with power lives and thrives on fear, and that is what the representatives of Religion and Empire did to the people around Jesus. Isolation and loneliness create more fear and helplessness. The opposite of fear is *hope*, and the disciples' acquaintances demonstrated that the *Risen Christ* empowered them to *overcome fear* and *celebrate hope*.

Apostle Paul talks about the visible and invisible or the seen and the unseen experiences of faith resulting in *Hope* and illustrates, "For in hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what is seen? But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience." (Romans 8:24-25). For Paul, our struggling questions of our day are probably the same questions. In this life, can we experience the reality of our glorification, or only the hope of it? But Paul would indicate that the hope of every follower of Christ is based on God's promise, and the gift of salvation is the foundation of hope. *The German Theologian, Juergen Moltmann*, brought to discussion in *Theology and Mission*, the possibility of hope, and grounds it on the resurrection of hope. He observes, "I began to understand that the assailed Christ...who takes the prisoners with him on his way to resurrection. I began to summon up the courage to live again, seized by a great hope." The *Theology of Hope* articulates the idea that the Christian faith is lived in witness to the promises of a God who can and will make all things right. These promises are offered most clearly in the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

The words of the Apostle Paul are echoed in a different context by the *Prophet Habakkuk*, where he talks of himself as a Sentinel (Watchman), and a vision from God in 2:2-3, “*Then the LORD answered me and said: Write the vision; make it plain on tablets, so that a runner may read it. For there is still a vision for the appointed time; it speaks of the end, and does not lie. If it seems to tarry, wait for it; it will surely come, it will not delay.*”

The *Celebration of Easter* is a celebration of the *Risen Christ*, a celebration of love, of hope, but more importantly the triumph of hope over fear and the courage to hope in the midst of fear, and share the *Good News of Fearless Hope*. It is in this context, the early Church celebrated this fearless hope with the mutual wish:

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!

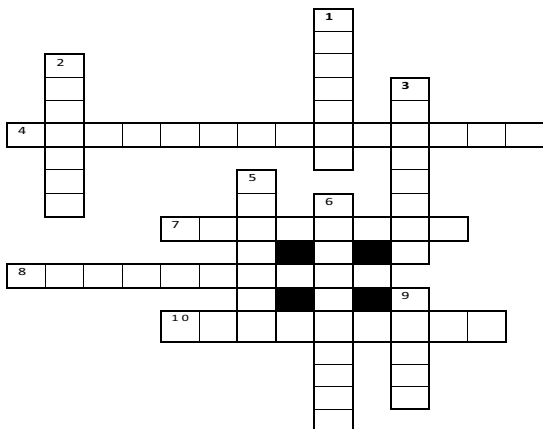


SEEKER'S NOOK
