From the Presbyter's Desk Pentecost: Translating Change

"All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability." (Acts 2:4)

In the words of the Danish Philosopher Soren Kierkegard, "In the world of spirit, to change place is to be changed yourself." The experience and diverse meanings of the experience of Pentecost in the life of the early Church is in reality a vision for the Church in the Present. In the original Greek Language, Pentecost simply means "fiftieth." Pentecost was a Jewish celebration of the spring harvest and the revelation of the law at Mount Sinai. Fifty days after the resurrection of Jesus Christ, the story of Pentecost became a story of 'translating change' among the believers who initially numbered 120, and went on to impact 3000 people. We read clear backgrounds in the Old Testament for the celebration of Pentecost by the early Church, for example in the Book of Leviticus:

"And from the day after the sabbath, from the day on which you bring the sheaf of the elevation offering, you shall count off seven weeks; they shall be complete. You shall count until the day after the seventh sabbath, fifty days; then you shall present an offering of new grain to the LORD. You shall bring from your settlements two loaves of bread as an elevation offering, each made of two-tenths of an ephah; they shall be of choice flour, baked with leaven, as first fruits to the LORD" (Leviticus 23:15-17).

The description in the Book of Leviticus, offers a vivid description of the agricultural background of the celebration and the idea of bringing our offerings to God. The celebration in the early Church is all about understanding the message in the original and translating change.

The Change began with the moving away from one tongue, Hebrew, to different languages. Pentecost provided a vision that words and works of God can be spoken and understood in different languages and dialects of many peoples. The vision for the Church is to celebrate difference and diversity. The Pentecost experience is not an exclusive or individual experience of the Holy Spirit, but "All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit" (Acts 2:4) and they were able to speak in other languages, "as the Spirit gave them ability" (Acts 2:4). The celebration of Pentecost teaches us that unity is possible in the power of the Holy Spirit and human made distinctions and difference can be overcome. Language is not simply about words, syntax and vocabulary, but it is about culture, social relations and history, and the Pentecost envisioned change and translated change, for a more just and peaceful community of faith, called the Church.

May we take time to live out Spirit filled lives and be channels of translating change!



Pentecost and Mount Sinai

There are many compelling similarities between the expressions of God's presence on Mount Sinai and His presence among the disciples during Pentecost. God's plans for us were made since the beginning of time, what a mighty God we serve!

On Mount Sinai, God's presence was accompanied by fire, smoke, and the sound of thunder (Ex. 19:16-19).

During Pentecost God's presence was accompanied by the sound of wind, tongues of fire, and the gift of different languages (Acts 2:1-3).

When God gave the Laws to Moses on Mount Sinai, the people were worshiping the golden calf. About 3,000 people died as punishment for their sins.

When the Holy Spirit was given during Pentecost, people repented, and about 3,000 people believed and found spiritual life.

God's presence was symbolized by a cloud and fire, which led the Israelites out of Egypt. Later, God moved his presence into the temple (2 Chron. 5:7-8, 13-14). At Pentecost, God's presence moved from the temple into a "new temple," the followers of Jesus (Rom. 8:9).

Finally, the Laws provided God's teachings for the Old Testament community of people. At Pentecost, the Holy Spirit became the Teacher of believers (John 14:26).
