

From the Presbyter's Desk

160 years of St. Andrew's Church Towards Empowering in God's Mission

"And immediately they left their nets and followed him." (Mark 1:18)

History is a story of the constant engagement between character and power, thought and deed, idea and action and more importantly, of persons and communities. History is important and meaningful, because of the experiences of the past and the visions for the future, with courage to live in the present. We are preparing to celebrate the Feast Day of our Patron Saint, Andrew, the first Apostle called by our Lord. On the Calendar of Saints of the Roman and Greek Churches, Andrew's date is set as November 30, which is Andrew's Feast Day.

It is a matter of immense joy that we share this history in terms of forms of *Worship, Architecture, and Governance Patterns* with churches all over the world, sharing the *Presbyterian* legacy from Scotland.

Going down memory lane, the foundation stone for this magnificent structure was laid on *November 22, 1864* and the building was completed and opened for divine worship on *November 18, 1866.* St. Andrew's Church joined the *Church of South India* in *September 1959* and is governed by the *Karnataka Central Diocese.* Worship Services in *Kannada* was started in *1965* and ever since, Kannada has found a place along with English in regular Worship and Ministry engagement. We celebrated *150 years in 2014,* and the Souvenir, our Official Website and the Visitor's Brochure help us to turn the pages of history.

Christian Discipleship is one of the greatest stories told and retold, because Discipleship in itself is an act of empowerment. Empowerment is an act of faith, courage and hope; it is an act of dependence and obedience to God's will. Andrew was the first person called to be an Apostle by Jesus as he began his public ministry (John 1:40-42). Historically, it is Peter who has received a preeminent place, although it was Andrew who first met Jesus and took Peter to meet him. In Mark 1:16-20, Jesus calls the first disciples who were fishermen, and one of the most powerful words of Jesus, "Follow me," is followed by an act by Andrew and Peter - they leave behind everything and follow him.

The story of discipleship is not about the strong becoming stronger or the rich becoming richer, it is a story of *empowerment* of the poor, the weak, and the vulnerable. It is the story of many, of the multitude and everyone who can participate in God's Mission, as the Apostle Paul would continue to share this message with the Community at Corinth, by saying, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness" (2 Cor 12:9). Empowerment is the celebration of Grace as God's agency, to receive and to act independently, an ability of each person in the everyday social life of the individual and the community. The members of the Pastorate Committee for the Triennium 2024-27, at the One-day Retreat, deliberated on our Vision Statement, and arrived at a consensus that as we value the idea of equipping, we need to add the word *empowering*, and thus our Vision Statement will read: "Equipping and Empowering Congregation in God's Mission."

We are deeply grateful for each person, family and communities who have contributed to the spiritual nurture and growth of our church over the years, with special mention of the *Clergy* and the *Laity* who have provided valuable spiritual leadership. We are thankful for the partnership of the *Clergy* and the *Laity* that continues to define the spiritual ethos and growing diversity of the congregation.

The current leadership in the Pastorate Committee along with several inputs from many of you in the congregation, has arrived at initiating *Four Visions* for the future in our key areas that are considered foundational for the *Unity and Mission of the Church as we commemorate the 160 years of God's faithfulness and grace:*

1. Worship

Our *Worship Services* during the month of November and towards Andrew's Day will revolve around different themes around the life of the *Apostle Andrew*, an opportunity to rediscover the Apostle and his ministry.

2. Fellowship

Our vision to extend the fellowship to those who need care and love during the growing years, and therefore a vision of "St Andrew's Home for the Elderly," an opportunity for care on church campus.

3. Discipleship

While we continue to be committed to build a church for the worshipping community at Tubagere, we commit ourselves to a new Mission Field in an unreached area, ensuring that the 'Project Andrew,' will be a continuing project of discipleship.

4. Service

Empowering children and youth in education is a way of empowerment. The vision is to initiate *endowments* to support General Scholarships disbursed annually to the children in our church.

Some more thoughts on the Apostle Andrew:

Andrew also became popular in the West. In the year 1204, Crusaders stole Andrew's relics from Constantinople and took them to Amalfi, Italy. According to ancient Celtic tradition, St. Regulus (4th century) took the apostle's arm to St. Andrews, Scotland, and thus Andrew became known as the Patron Saint of Scotland. There is a scholarly consensus about the tradition that Andrew died at Patrae in Achaia. A story developed that he was martyred on an X-shaped cross (a "decussate" or "saltire" cross), which has become known as St. Andrew's cross. St. Andrew's cross has been and is an iconic representation of our church.

We will be celebrating *St. Andrew's Day on Sunday the 24th* of this month at a *Combined Communion Worship Service* beginning at 9 am.
