From the Presbyter's Desk



The Paradox of Equality

"I am about to do a new thing...." (Isaiah 43:19)

Thanks be to God for a New Year, and each year that has gone by! Wishing you a Blessed and a Promising New Year!

One of the precious gifts I received recently was the *Seventeenth edition of the Constitution of India*, both in Kannada and English, published in 2024. Although I had copies, the new edition, compact and beautifully leather-bound, filled me with emotions of joy and pride. The first words in the *Foreword by K. K. Venugopal*, Senior Advocate, Supreme Court of India, was indeed captivating, "When you hold this small leather-bound book in your hands, you are holding the very destiny of this nation written 70 years ago." In addition, the pointed introduction about our country by *Prof. Ranbir Singh*, titled, "About India," is exciting and only makes you proud of its rich diversity and the continuous progress as a nation. On *January 26*, 1950, our *Constitution* came into force and as the *Preamble* declares, "We the People of India, having solemnly resolved to constitute India into a Sovereign, Socialist, Secular, Democratic Republic." The supremacy of the Constitution meant the abolition of the *Government of India Act*, 1935, which had effectively been the governing document even after *Independence in 1947*. Therefore, the claim to be a 'Republic,' essential to the identity of our Country, and the strong ethical and social claim that is unique, showed the way to many colonies of the British Raj.

The *Preamble* of the *Indian Constitution* contains in itself the guiding principles and also the vision for all its citizens, with the four principles: *Justice, Liberty, Equality and Fraternity. Dr B. R. Ambedkar,* the Chairman of the Drafting Committee of the Constitution in his many writings had provided commentary on the four ideals or principles governing the Constitution. For Dr Ambedkar, *Equality* was one of the key principles in India's religious and cultural history, and had great potential, and he observed, *"Equality may be a fiction but nonetheless one must accept it as a governing principle."* In the break from the colonial past, the paradox of equality: *social, economic, religious and political,* was a vision that continues to be realized, while celebrating our continuing celebration as a *'Republic.'*

The *Prophet Isaiah* at a different time and in a different context, was echoing similar views and viewed collective memory of the people as important. In his prophetic message, Isaiah recalls God's active intervention in the past with the bondage in Egypt and the Exodus event. The Prophet authenticates the contemporary reality of God's providence by underling God's unwavering faithfulness. *What is the new thing that old is about to do?* In v.19, "Way in the wilderness" and "rivers in the desert," recalls the Exodus event and the question, "do you not perceive it?" It means that the people must be open to the possibility of change and the opportunity to begin anew. The prophet cautions the people about the new forms of captivity, inequality being one of them. The call is to perceive the advent of God who celebrates deliverance from all forms of bondage. Our seasonal celebration of *Advent* is not over, it continues to echo new beginnings with the living presence of Jesus Christ in our lives, families and communities, and with people who do not have an identity and feel excluded from communities.

The paradox of equality is a challenge for churches too. This year the Annual Week of Prayer for Christian Unity (January 18 to January 25), will be special, as it marks the 1700th anniversary of the first Ecumenical Council held in Nicaea, near Constantinople in 325 AD.

Our Worship together and conversations will provide a unique opportunity to *reflect on and celebrate the common faith of Christians* as expressed in the *Nicene Creed,* formulated during the *Council;* a faith that remains alive and fruitful in our days. We look forward to our time of celebration of Worship with our brothers and sisters from the Roman Catholic Church.

We are thankful for a joyful and meaningful celebration of the *Advent Season* with each *Ministry/Fellowship* celebrating with elaborate preparations and enthusiasm. In addition, it is commendable that efforts were made to share the love of Christ with people who are excluded and in the margins. We are deeply grateful for your sincere prayers and generous support for each of the initiatives, which is only growing and enriching.

The Lord has been faithful in enabling us to the *Projects* taken up as part of the *Harvest Thanksgiving in 2024*, and there will be updates on that too.

We are grateful to God for 160 years of His faithfulness and mercy as a faith community, and to God's people and God's servants who have contributed and continue to contribute to its unity, mission and ministry. As part of the 160 years celebrations, three new visions have been envisioned collectively. We sincerely thank you for your prayers and overwhelming support already for the same. In addition, a creative Souvenir is also being created, so that each family can remember the life and witness of our church. It is our desire that the Souvenir along with the 160th year Vision Brochure will reach each of your homes during the coming days.

Let us continue to look to God as we wait upon *Him* and be open for a *new thing* this year and always!


