

From the Presbyter's Desk

Work and Productive Living

"We were not idle when we were with you" (2 Thessalonians 3:7)

We begin the month of May, celebrating *Labour* or as *Workers Day*. It almost passes off as another holiday, a day to rest from work, a time to be idle and become more productive. Commemorating *May Day* on the first is more than symbolic remembrance. The coming together of the workers and the workers movement brought the concerns of the workers to the table and compelled employers to negotiate and talk together. The workers' movement brought the *'movement*,' to a new level of understanding and action. Many concerns of the workers, including daily wages, labour laws, have received the much-needed attention. It brought the idea of *'work*, 'to the forefront and initiated the discussion about productivity.

Apostle Paul while instructing the early Christian community in Thessalonica (2 Thess. 3:6-12), called people to exercise discipline in terms of work. The believers probably became idle, expecting the return of the Lord. It maybe also because lazy Christians were exploiting the charity of wealthier Christians and used their free time to meddle with others' affairs. Paul strongly encourages the community to be productive by discipline and not depend on others for a living. Productivity is a choice one makes in one's life with the time, talent and resources one has. It is a measure of the efficiency of a person, machine or system. For many, productivity is an absolute good, an obvious goal for ourselves and for the organizations where we work. It is about quality and not about quantity. There are also theories which propose moments of idleness promotes better productivity. What we today in contemporary language call as, 'taking a break.' Paul encourages believers to 'keep away from believers who are living in idleness' (3:6), and uses even more strong language, 'Anyone unwilling to work should not eat' (3:10). Even in the creation narrative, God intended in the Garden of Eden, 'to work and keep it' (Genesis 2:15).

God wants us to be productive in all spheres of our life, including our mind. As the popular saying goes, 'An Idle mind is devil's workshop!'. Let us be productive with our time and the gifts that God has given us, in Church and Society, in order to make a difference, even as we think of work and workers in all spheres and areas that we encounter.


Their rendering was truly uplifting for they sang with much conviction, and indeed, it touched many a heart!

REFLECTION

A PRAYING MOTHER: AMELIA TAYLOR

Hudson Taylor (1832-1905) was a great missionary in China whose obedience led thousands to Christ. Though he grew up in a Christian home he was once a scoffer, a rebel, and an avaricious teen. But God used his mother's prayers to pull Hudson out of his rebellion.

Hudson's mother, Amelia, noticed the turmoil that her son was in. She knew that the only way his heart would be changed was if he had a radical encounter with Jesus. She travelled 50 miles from their home in Barnsley, England, to visit her sister. It was during this time that she locked herself in her room for hours and pleaded to God that He would save Hudson. She decided not leave the room until she came to a sense of assurance that God would save him. Her heart soon turned from pleading to praise when she found herself worshiping and thanking God that He had opened Hudson's eyes to salvation.

Back at home, Hudson was bored and meandered in his father's library, where he found a gospel tract titled "Poor Richard" and read the words, "the finished work of Christ." It was that day that Hudson understood that Christ's work on the cross was sufficient for his salvation, and repented, and committed his life to the Lord, promising to serve him forever. He soon learned that as he was on his knees praising God for his salvation, his mother was doing the very same thing, though many miles away. Transformed, he soon committed his life to missionary work, trained as a doctor, began to preach, and at last departed for China in 1853. Taylor spent 51 years in China and found the China Inland Mission leading thousands to Christ. His story cannot be told without giving due credit to the power of a praying mother.

The commitment of a mother calls for the spiritual care of children by setting an example for them in the way of righteousness. Surely an eternal reward awaits the faithful mother who is steadfast in her desire to see her children grow to be even more like Christ than she.
