From the Presbyter's Desk

Theology: Growing with Foundations

"Ground that drinks up the rain falling on it repeatedly, and that produces a crop useful to those for whom it is cultivated, receives a blessing from God" (Hebrews 6:7)

Theology, talk or study about God, and ideas around Theology, can risk repetition, but *Christian Theology* grounded on the Bible, its understanding can only grow with foundations by repetition. Our focus during this month, will be on *Theological Education* and ideas related to the *Church and its ministry.*

The Writer to Hebrews, shares an important metaphor of ground that needs rainwater repeatedly in order to be productive. Ground that does not receive rainwater, fails to be productive. There is no better nourishing of the ground than rainwater. Theological Education and Ministerial Formation can be compared to this metaphor of ground that needs to be constantly nurtured.

The formal *Theological Education* is an intentional and purpose-driven formation practice, which prepares a person for full-time ministry in the Church and beyond. Formation based on biblical, historical and social foundations are important for a student of Theology to unlearn and relearn the perspectives much needed for growth. The *Writer to the Hebrews* in 6:1-8, exhorts the early Christian believers to move forward in the Christian journey of faith, by building on the basic teaching of Christ to other areas of faith like baptism, resurrection of the dead, and eternal judgement. (6:2).

The word '*Theology*, 'can put us off in the pews, because, the common imagination is one of Theology being abstract, not real and not connecting to the social reality of the people. But Theology has made a difference and can continue to make a difference by affirming the *God of the Bible as a God of Life*, a God involved in liberation, and Theology as *praxis* of seeking freedom for life to flourish. In the midst of enslavement, hierarchy, oppression and other forms of evil, new forms of Theological Education and conversations with the people of God can become transformative and life giving.

Christian Theology has provoked and provided the Christian Church the needed impetus to engage with the social order, and broaden our engagement with justice and peace, while we celebrate as a worshipping community.

Theology, like the ground, needs continually to grow both within and outside, while keeping the foundations firm and alive.

Environment Sunday The Leaves for Healing: Our Response to Creation Care



We joyfully observed *Environment Sunday on the 30th of June 2025,* with the *Altar* beautifully adorned with flowers and plants, symbolizing our gratitude for *God's Creation.*

In a deeply inspiring Sermon, *Rev. Dr. Allan Palanna* reminded us how the Bible begins and ends in a *garden*, drawing from Jesus' many parables that reference creation. He emphasized living life in its

fullness as in *St. John 10:10*, and highlighted *Revelation 22:2: "the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations."* The sermon stirred our hearts to reflect on our role as stewards of God's earth. *Rev. Dr. Dexter S. Maben,* our Presbyter, affirmed our church's ongoing commitment to *Environmental Care,* guided by the *Property and Environment Concern Committee.* Small, intentional steps have been taken to make our *Campus* more *Eco-conscious.*

Highlights of our Green Initiatives:

- *Eco-Friendly Coir Mats:* Flooring made from Coconut Coir sourced from Kerala, supporting natural materials and rural livelihoods.
- Plastic-Free Benches: Bamboo Cane Weaving replaces synthetic materials on seating.
- Green Spaces: Continuous planting of flowering plants throughout the compound.
- Digital First: Soft copies of Newsletters and Pew Slips are encouraged to reduce paper usage.
- Rainwater Harvesting: Collected rainwater is reused for garden maintenance.
- Solar Lighting: The garden is illuminated using Solar-powered Lamp Posts, with plans to expand usage.
- Reusable Coffee Cups: Paper and plastic cups have been phased out.
- · Composting: Organic waste and dry leaves are turned into compost for garden enrichment.

To mark the occasion, *Saplings* were planted in the church garden by *Rev. Dr. Dexter S. Maben, Rev. Dr. Allan Palanna,* and *Students* from the United Theological College, *Ms. Steffi Deva Priya* (3rd Year, Madras Diocese), and *Mr. Paul Dhinakaran* (2nd Year, Medak Diocese), after both the *Kannada and English Worship Services.*

These efforts reflect our commitment to *walk gently upon the earth,* honouring our shared responsibility to care for *God's Creation.*

Study God's Word regularly



Discernment begins with knowing the truth. The Bible equips us to distinguish right from wrong and understand God's will (Hebrews 4:12)



Being sensitive to the Holy Spirit helps us recognise what aligns with God's will and exposes falsehood. (1 Corinthians 2:14)



Seek the guidance of the Guard your heart and mind

Be vigilant over what influences your thoughts and decisions. Avoid worldly influences and renew the mind with God's truth. (Romans 12:2)

Practice Obedience



Walking in obedience to God's revelation will strengthen discernment. Faithfulness in small things open the way for greater insights. (John 7:17)

Test all things



We must examine teachings, circumstances, and advice in the light of Scriptures. (1 John 4:1)

Develop a love for Truth



A heart that treasures God's truth resists deception. Love for truth keeps us anchored, even when confronted with popular opinions. (John 8:32)

Practical tips for everyday life

- When faced with a choice, pause and ask, "What does Scripture say about this?"
- Write down insights or verses that speak to your situation.
- Discuss your decisions with a friend or mentor who knows the Word well.
- Remember that discernment is a journey, practice it daily and trust that God is refining your judgment.
