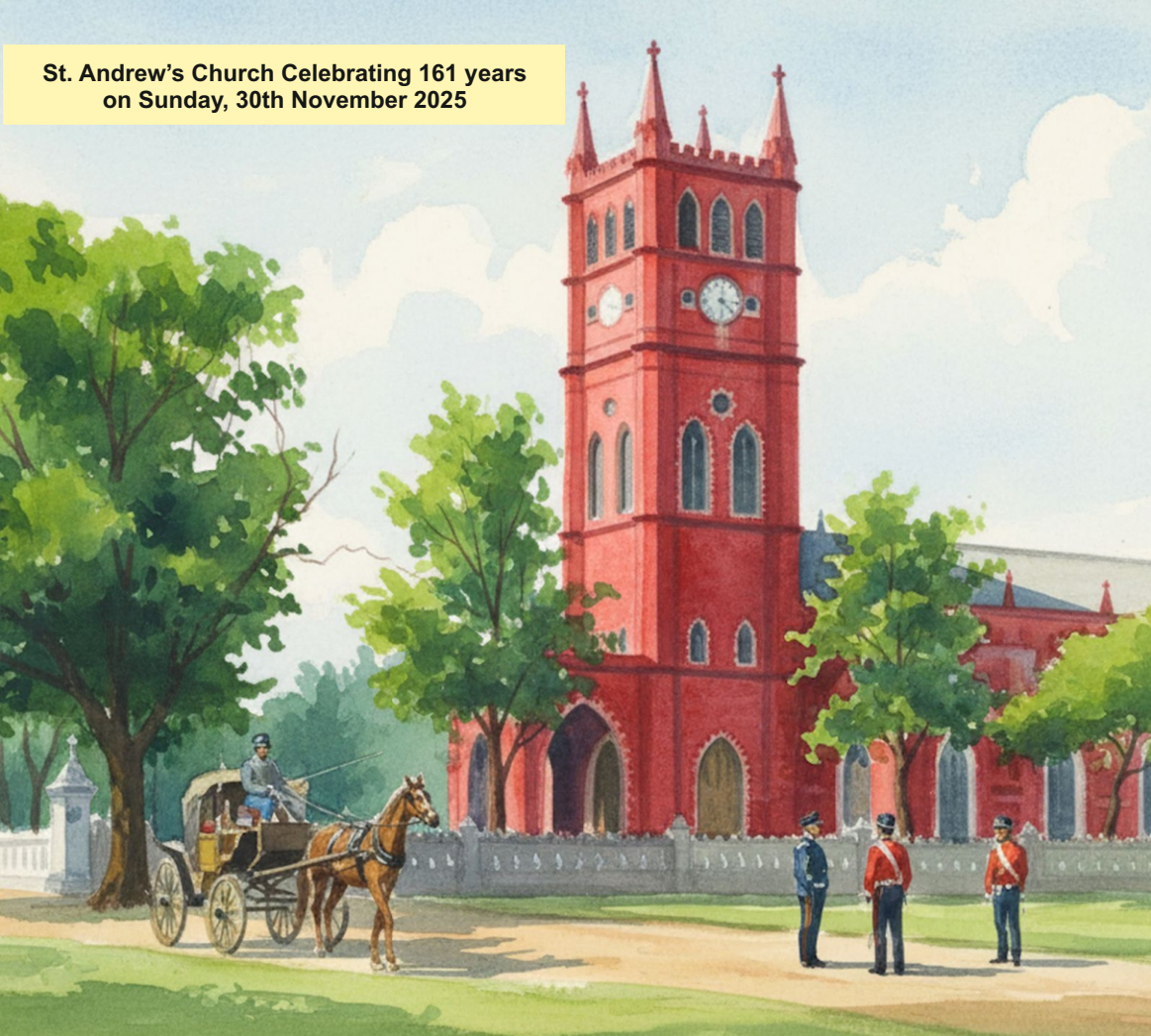

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From the Presbyterian's Desk

“Unity of Church and its Response to Violence” (Deuteronomy 26:1 - 11)

Unity of the Church: Responding to Violence

Understanding Violence

Christians understand violence as a symptom of humanity's fallen state. It springs from a broken relationship with God that leads to fear and hatred. Acts aimed at harming individuals or communities are born from the ancestral rebellion of Adam and Cain. As the world grapples with violence, the Church is not immune; institutionalization has dulled its redemptive power and the curse of Babel has divided it, rendering a fractured church unable to offer redemption. As Genesis reminds us, *“Therefore its name was called Babel, because there the Lord confused the language of all the earth”* (Genesis 11:9).

Importance of Unity

Jesus prayed for unity among believers:

“I ask not only on behalf of these, but also on behalf of those who will believe in me through their word, that they may all be one. As You, Father, are in Me and I am in You, may they also be in us, so that the world may believe that You have sent Me. The glory that You have given Me I have given them, so that they may be one, as We are one, I in them and You in Me, that they may become completely one” (John 17:20-23).

He longs for a unity that mirrors the oneness between Himself and the Father. This plea should encourage us to dismantle walls that separate congregations and work toward visible unity.

Core Values of the Church

The Church is meant to reflect four essential virtues:

- ***Reconciliation*** - healing divisions and restoring broken relationships.
- ***Love*** - embodying unconditional, Christ-like love for all people.
- ***Forgiveness*** - extending grace to those who have caused harm.
- ***Service*** - selflessly meeting the needs of others.

These characteristics are the heart of Christian witness. Without them, our message of peace rings hollow.

Modern Challenges and Introspection

In an age dominated by social media, we must ask whether we are spreading reconciliation, love, forgiveness and service, or whether we contribute to violence. Violence manifests in many forms - psychological, physical, sexual, emotional, financial, verbal, cultural and even technologically assisted. As Bertrand Russell observed, *“War does not determine who is right but only who is left”*. Our challenge is to resist subtle violence and instead model Christ's peace. We should also examine our hearts: are we reconcilers, do we love our neighbours, do we extend forgiveness, and are we ready to serve?

Embodying Christ's Response

Christ entered a violent world as the alternative to violence. His followers are called to be at the forefront of reconciliation, agents of love, symbols of forgiveness and willing servants. When believers grasp the plea of their Saviour, the Church's response to violence changes: it hoists the flag of reconciliation, becomes a centre of love, welcomes sinners because they are forgiven and saved, and cares for the hurting.

Returning to our Original Identity

The curse of Babel once divided humanity through language and confession, but Christ's coming reversed that division. At Pentecost, the Holy Spirit united God's people and gave birth to the Church. Luke records: *"When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place... All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability"* (Acts 2:1-4). Today, it is vital for the Church to reclaim its original identity as a unified, redemptive community, one that responds to violence with reconciliation and love.

Conclusion

As we consider our current context, let us ask ourselves: Are we people of reconciliation? Do we genuinely love our neighbours? Do we nurture hearts that forgive? Are we willing to serve? May these questions guide St. Andrew's as we seek to be a unified and healing presence in a world marked by division.

Women's Fellowship



Greetings to all of you in the Precious Name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ!

St. Andrew's Church Women's Fellowship met for the monthly *Bible Study* on *Saturday, 4th October 2025*.

The Session was called: *Jesus Enables the Faithful*. This was about Mary and Martha and their relationship with Jesus. It was taken from *John 11:1-5, 11-44*.

We learnt about Jesus revealing his compassion when told of Lazarus's death, then displaying his power over death when he called Lazarus out of the tomb. We discussed how his decision to delay going to Bethany brings glory to him and hope to all of us. Then we studied Martha's confrontation with Jesus when he finally arrived. When has God disappointed us? How have we dealt with those feelings? We reviewed Martha's statements of faith. What divine characteristics did she affirm, and what titles did she give Jesus?

Life brings disappointment to everyone at some point. Martha was upset with Jesus for not coming in time to heal her brother. What can we learn from her response to Jesus when she saw him? Consider Mary's reaction when Jesus arrived, then think of a time when we grieved deeply. How does her response help you to worship God because he's good, even if he decides not to change your situation.

Mary and Martha were not afraid to express their pain and disappointments to Jesus. How do we tend to approach God in those situations - are we honest, or do we hold back? Consider how we can pray in full honesty to the God who loves us unconditionally.

Think of some *"impossible"* situations in which we needed God to work. This made all of us share a lot of testimonies where the Lord showed up in impossible situations and helped us. This sharing was a huge blessing to all of us to be able to trust in our loving *Heavenly Father* who is able to do much more than we can ask or imagine.

Then we reflected on Mary and Martha's extraordinary faith in the wake of their brother's death. Which of them do we resemble more? The last part was homework where we were made to think of a statement of faith in our all-powerful yet compassionate God.

We are all very grateful to our dear *Kumuda* for leading and enlightening us in the Bible Study. May our Lord bless her efforts.

- The fifth reference: *Zachariah 14:4*.
- The sixth reference : *Matthew 24:38*, '*Like in the days of Noah so it will be in the days of the Coming of The Son of Man, meaning people will be thinking of themselves and living in their own pleasures forgetting to live for Christ's return*'.
- The seventh reference: *1 Thessalonians 5:3*, '*False peace trying to be established*'.
- The eighth reference: *Matthew 24: 14*, '*The Gospel being preached through the ends of the earth*'.

- The ninth reference: *II Timothy 3:1-5*, 'people will be lovers of themselves and pleasures, and will be far away from God'.
- The tenth reference: *Matthew 24: 5-51*, 'There will be wars, earthquakes, false prophets, Sun will be darkened and moon will not give its light, but the gospel will be preached to the ends of the earth'.
- The eleventh reference: *1 Thessalonians 4: 16 - 18*, *The Day of Rapture*.
- The twelfth reference: *Daniel 12:4*, *advances in the field of Science & Technology*.

This month we will celebrate the 161st Anniversary of St. Andrew's Church. History suggests that in the early 1860's, Bangalore had a sizable number of Scottish residents, as well as Scottish soldiers and officers. They felt the need for a 'Kirk' (Church in Scottish) of their own. Named after the Scottish Patron, Saint Andrew, the foundation stone of St. Andrew's Church was laid by Lady Grant on 22nd November, 1864. The Church was consecrated by Rev. Stewart Wright on the 18th of November, 1866, and opened for public worship on 22nd November, 1866. It was called "Red Kirk" as the external structure was painted red.

SUNDAY SCHOOL

We will observe World Sunday School Day on Sunday, the 9th of November, 2025. On this day we remember the promoters of Sunday Schools and acknowledge the role of Sunday Schools in nurturing the spiritual, emotional, and moral growth of children and youth. Robert Raikes, editor of the Gloucester Journal, is commonly said to be the pioneer of Sunday School. In 1781, he recognised the need to prevent children living in the Gloucester slums from taking up crime. He began the school in a home, operating it on Sundays – the only day that the boys and girls working in the factories could attend. Using the Bible as their textbook, the children learned to read and write.
