From the Presbyter's Desk



"Celebrating God's Covenant" (Isaiah 54:10)

At the very beginning of the creation, God had a vision for humans as the crown of creation but because of disobedience the fall occurred. The relationship between humans and God was broken and fear entered.

God had a plan to save humankind but the word that was spoken had to be executed. Biblical history speaks about prophets who were not received well and the people of God rejected God's redemption. Prophets spoke about the birth of the Messiah "Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Look, the young woman is with child and shall bear a son and shall name him Immanuel" (Isaiah 7:14), which portrayed God's presence with us. When there was absolutely no hope and the world was in total chaos, there was a birth "Look, the virgin shall become pregnant and give birth to a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel," which means, "God is with us." Care for The Elderly

Greeting to you all in the precious Name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. We are delighted to have had *Dr. Vijaya Prabha* from Baptist Hospital address us on the topic "Passing the Baton of Faith and God's Work to the Next Generation". We thank our Lord Jesus for being with us as we heard this message.

We were led by the *Youth* in *Praise and Worship*, after which our Presbyter opened the meeting with a Word of Prayer. This topic was interesting as the Lord spoke to us about the importance of mental health and how the current generation needs help from our elders to support them in this. The topic was more on how today's generation struggle with many mental issues and the role of the older generation's support to them. *Psalm 78: 4-7* instructs the present generation to tell the next about God's glorious deeds, power and wonders. Dr. Vijaya gave examples of Abraham, Moses and others on how they showed their children the way forward. In *Deuteronomy 4* as part of Moses' last farewell speech after 40 years, he reminds the Israelites about the Lord's doing at Mount Horeb, about how they heard God's voice, felt HIS presence, and calling them to obey the Lord's commands, and by also reminding them of HIS promise.

This too must be passed on to the next generation, because they are the ones to take it forward, where Moses encourages Joshua to take up the torch. We are instructed in the same way to remind our younger generation about the promise and the presence of the Lord. We must at least spend one meal a day with them at the least. *Isaiah 40:31* states 'When we put our trust and Hope in the Lord, he will carry us on his wings like eagles do and we will not grow weary'. *Genesis 47:8-9* talks about Joseph telling Pharoah about his father Jacob and his brothers, and Jacob blessed Pharoah and left.

We had our church member play some games with the elders, which was followed by a Fellowship Lunch.

Reflection

SILENT NIGHT

"Silent Night" (German: "Stille Nacht, heilige Nacht") is a popular Christmas carol, composed in 1818 by Franz Xaver Gruber to lyrics by Joseph Mohr in Oberndorf bei Salzburg, Austria.

The story behind its creation:

The Poem: Joseph Mohr wrote the six-stanza German poem "Stille Nacht" in 1816 while serving as an assistant priest in Mariapfarr, a village suffering from the aftermath of the Napoleonic Wars and the "Year without a summer" which caused famine and hardship. His words offered a message of hope and peace during a turbulent time.

The Music: Two years later, on Christmas Eve, 1818, Mohr was in Oberndorf bei Salzburg, where he presented his poem to Franz Xaver Gruber, the local schoolteacher and organist. Mohr asked Gruber to compose a melody for it, suitable for two voices and a guitar accompaniment. The popular legend suggests this was a last-minute solution because the church organ was broken (perhaps from mice chewing the bellows), but the guitar might have been chosen simply by design or lack of time to compose for the organ.

The First Performance: That same night, at the Christmas Eve Mass in the St. Nicholas Church in Oberndorf, the carol was performed for the first time. Mohr sang tenor and played the guitar, while Gruber sang bass.

Global Spread: An organ builder and repairer, Karl Mauracher, took the song's score back to his home in the Tyrolean Ziller Valley a few weeks later. There, two traveling families of folk singers, the Rainers and the Strassers, incorporated it into their repertoire and helped spread it across Europe and eventually to the United States.

Legacy: Today, the original St. Nicholas Church is gone (due to flooding), but the Silent Night Chapel stands on the site in Oberndorf as a memorial. The simple, peaceful melody and lyrics resonated with people worldwide, and the song has since been translated into over 300 languages. In 2011, UNESCO declared "Silent Night" an intangible cultural heritage. The song was first recorded in 1905 and is one of the most recorded Christmas songs.
