Lent: Walking in Humility, Prayers and Repentance

"If my people who are called by my name humble themselves, pray, seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin and heal their land." (2 Chronicles 7:14)

The Holy Scriptures present before us the unfolding story of God's chosen people 'the Hebrews', a sacred history marked by both faithfulness and failure, devotion and disobedience, nearness to God and estrangement from Him. Time and again, when they kept God at the centre of their lives, they flourished under His grace. Yet whenever they wandered from His ways, their relationship with Him was broken, and they experienced the consequences of spiritual distance.

Their fall was not due to God's absence, but due to their forgetfulness forgetting that they were chosen, called, and set apart to live lives centred on Him.

Nevertheless, the steadfast love of the Lord never ceased. In every season of rebellion, God extended an invitation a call to repentance and return.

As we approach the holy season of Lent, this divine call becomes especially relevant to us. The words recorded in 2 Chronicles 7:14 continue to speak with power and clarity:

"If my people who are called by my name humble themselves, pray, seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin and heal their land."

This gracious promise reveals God's pattern of restoration a threefold path for His people:

- Humbling ourselves before His holy presence
- Praying and earnestly seeking His face
- Turning away from all sin and unrighteousness

When King Solomon dedicated the temple, God gave this sacred assurance that repentance invites renewal and humility leads to healing. The same assurance remains true for the Church today.

Therefore, Lent is not merely a season marked by tradition or observance. It is a solemn and sacred time of self-examination. It calls us to quiet reflection, sincere prayer, and genuine repentance. It is a time to realign our hearts with God's will and to restore Him to the rightful centre of our lives.

May this Lenten season draw us into deeper humility, stronger faith, and truer obedience. May we seek His face with reverence, turn away from all that displeases Him, and experience the fullness of His forgiveness and restoration.

May the Lord renew His Church and strengthen His people.

Women's Fellowship

Greeting to all of you in the precious name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

For the first time in the New Year, 2026, St. Andrew's Church Women's fellowship met for their monthly Bible Study on Saturday, 17th January, 2026.

The Session was called: "Jesus Heals the Wounded." The study was taken from Luke 8:40-56 and it was the healing of the woman with an issue of blood and the raising up of Jairus' 12-year-old daughter.

The leaders marvelled over the breadth of Jesus's compassion - He healed the young and the old, men and women, insider and outsider. We discussed which characters were recipients of Jesus' care and in what ways were the people alike and how their stories differ. We got some very interesting perspectives from each one.

We learnt how this passage teaches women that they are valued - Jesus addressing the woman with the issue of blood as "daughter", and Jairus daughter as "My child!" We discussed how our Church values the voice of women. How do we individually advocate for other women, whether relationally, professionally or socially?

Jairus and the woman with the discharge of blood both exhibited hope - a conviction that Jesus could help them, followed by action to seek that help. They didn't give up. We discussed when we have shown hope in a difficult time - what or who helped us endure well? The ladies shared some beautiful stories from their lives when they held on to hope in Jesus and how He helped them come through. This sharing was a blessing indeed!

We discussed the ways in which Jesus broke cultural boundaries. In addition, what must have caused the woman with the discharge of blood to ignore life-long “rules of engagement” when Jesus came to town. We also discussed the parallels in this passage and what we learn about Jesus through his interactions with the woman, with Jairus, and with Jairus’s daughter.

Consider Jesus’s care for the sick woman and Jairus’s daughter. Neither of these people were prominent in that culture, yet he took time out of his schedule to meet their needs. Where in our church, or in our community, do you see needs? What sorts of needs? Together, we discussed some tangible ways we can express Jesus’s love to your hurting, lonely, sick, needy neighbours.



This session encouraged us to stay hopeful no matter how long we’ve suffered. It reminded us to know our value to God. It reminded us how it would look to remember these truths through hard times.

Through this Bible passage, we are encouraged not to give up hope: “That moment with Jesus is coming.” Our homework was to find Bible verses with hope and memorize them so that it can help us during difficult times. We ended with praying for each other to stay strong in the Lord always.

Extremely grateful to Mrs. Kumuda for conducting this Bible Study. May God reward her.

On Tuesday, the 20th of January 2026, our Bishop Amma, Mrs Caroline Anita David, Interim Secretary CSI women’s Fellowship, had this unique pleasure to warmly invite Mrs. Gay Curtis from Mothers Union, UK. We were privileged to host this special meeting in our church.

The following is a brief account directly from the desk of our Bishop Amma: “The Mothers’ Union was founded globally by Mary Sumner in 1876 in Old Alresford, England. The movement reached India soon afterward as part of the expansion of Anglican missions throughout the British Empire. Queen Victoria became its patron, followed by successive monarchs thereafter.

The Mothers’ Union in India is a significant Christian charity affiliated with the Women’s Fellowship for Christian Service in North and South India, with a large and active membership. It focuses on empowering vulnerable women and girls through vocational training, health education, and campaigns against gender-based violence and human trafficking. The organization operates at the grassroots level, strengthening family life and providing community support.



Within the Church of South India (CSI), the Women's Fellowship performs the role of the Mothers' Union and was formally affiliated with the worldwide organization in 2003.

Today, approximately 1.9 million of the organization's 4 million global members come from Indian dioceses, making it one of the largest chapters in the world.

When the Liaison Officer, Mrs. Gay Curtis, expressed her desire to visit the CSI Women's Fellowship headquarters in Bangalore, it provided an opportunity to rebuild our relationship with the Mothers' Union, which had weakened after the COVID-19 pandemic. As many members of the Women's Fellowship were unfamiliar with the Mothers' Union, I invited the President, Secretaries, and Treasurers of civil and city area churches to learn more about it and to share this knowledge with the KCD Women's Fellowship members. Through this initiative, we were able to strengthen and renew our relationship with the Mothers' Union."

The office bearers of the CSI KCD Women's Fellowships of various churches, actively and enthusiastically took part and made this evening a memorable experience for everyone present.

This year, we the Committee members of our Women's Fellowship, have decided to have Cottage Prayer Meetings in different localities, visit Elderly Homes and CSI Hospital. For this we need your prayers.

On the 31st of January, we the Women's Fellowship Committee members have decided to have the Cottage Prayers at the residence of Mrs. Shobha Bhasme. We are grateful to her for opening the doors of her home.

We praise and thank God Almighty for all the favours and blessings He has bestowed on us.

The Good Samaritan: Extending Compassion Beyond Boundaries

Open the Bible and you'll quickly find it - page after page soaked in the goodness of God. From the very beginning, when He shaped man from dust and breathed life into his lungs, to the rugged hill of Calvary where grace was poured out without measure, the story has never changed. God has been good. Not just in the grand, history-shaping moments, but in the quiet ones, too - through shepherds, widows, fishermen, and flawed prophets who somehow mirrored His heart.

The Parable of the Good Samaritan stands as one of the most powerful examples of goodness in Scripture. Found in Luke 10:25-37, this story illustrates true compassion that transcends social, ethnic, and religious barriers.

This parable answers the fundamental question: "Who is my neighbor?". Jesus teaches that true neighborliness isn't about proximity or similarity but about showing mercy to anyone in need. If you've ever wondered what goodness looks like when it rolls up its sleeves and gets its hands dirty, just listen to Jesus tell the story of the Good Samaritan.

A man in a ditch - beaten, bloodied, barely hanging on. Along come the religious elite. The kind of men you'd expect to stop - a priest, and a Levite. But they don't. They see him... and pass right by. Then comes the twist. A Samaritan shows up - a man from a people group the Jews wouldn't even speak to. And yet he's the one who steps in. He kneels beside the wounded stranger, cleans and bandages his wounds, places him on his own donkey, and walks him to safety. And just when you think the story's over, he reaches into his own wallet and says, "Whatever else he needs, I'll cover it."

Now that's goodness - coming from the least likely source. You see, true goodness doesn't measure worth or keep score. It crosses the street. It enters the mess. It pays the price.

Jesus wasn't just telling a nice story, He was holding up a mirror. He was saying, "This... is what love looks like. This is what it means to be a neighbor." The parable ends with Jesus's simple command: "Go and do likewise." This instruction calls believers to recognize everyone as worthy of compassion, regardless of differences. And in a world that often walks past pain with eyes averted, the Samaritan still speaks. He reminds us that the heart of God beats in those who stop, stoop, and serve.
