Stewardship

*"Love the Lord your God with all your heart,
with all your soul, and with all your mind" (Matthew 22:37)*

Dear Beloved in Christ,

As we observe the Month of Stewardship, it is important for us to reflect on what stewardship truly means. What has God entrusted to us? What are we called to be faithful stewards of?

The Bible teaches us that stewardship is about faithful guardianship and responsible accountability. Everything we have ultimately belongs to God, and we are entrusted with the responsibility of living according to His will and purpose.

In today's world, there is a danger of becoming overly concerned with earthly possessions and responsibilities while losing sight of the mission that Christ has entrusted to His Church. As Christians, our primary calling is not merely to manage material things, but to faithfully guard and proclaim the Gospel.

Our Lord Jesus Christ clearly reminds us of this in Matthew 22:36-40. When asked about the greatest commandment, He replied:

"Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind." This is the first and greatest commandment. He then added, *"Love your neighbour as yourself."* Jesus declared that all the Law and the Prophets are summed up in these two commandments.

Likewise, in Mark 16, Jesus commissions His disciples to "go into all the world and preach the Gospel." This remains the Church's mission today. We are stewards of the Good News, the message of God's love, grace, forgiveness, and salvation through Jesus Christ. We have been entrusted with the privilege and responsibility of sharing this Good News with the world.

As followers of Christ, let us ask ourselves: What kind of stewards are we? Are we faithfully living out God's call? Are we loving God wholeheartedly, loving our neighbours sincerely, and proclaiming His Gospel with conviction?

One day, each of us will give an account before God for the stewardship entrusted to us. May we therefore remain faithful, remembering that our greatest responsibility is to live for Christ and make His love known to others.

May God grant us the grace to be faithful stewards of His Kingdom.

Reports of Activities by the Wings & Ministries

Women's Fellowship



Greeting to you all in the precious name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

Our *Bible Study* was conducted on the *first Saturday* of the month, on the topic, *'Women of Integrity - Shiprah and Puah.'* (*Exodus 1:15 - 21*)

Shiprah and Puah, the Hebrew midwives in Egypt, stand as inspiring examples of *'integrity and courage.'* When Pharaoh commanded them to kill all Hebrew baby boys, they chose to obey God rather than follow an unjust order. Their reverence for God gave them the strength to protect innocent lives, even at great personal risk.

Their integrity was revealed through their *'faithfulness, courage, and wisdom.'* They valued God's commands above human authority and remained committed to doing what was right. As a result, God honoured them and blessed them.

The lives of *Shiprah and Puah* remind us that true integrity is choosing righteousness, even when it is difficult, and standing faithfully for God's truth in every circumstance.

Mrs. Eveline Sumana encouraged us with the story, *"Stones That Don't Hurt":* *"A little boy once threw a stone at a moving car. The driver, angry at the damage caused, stopped and got out to question him. The boy apologized and explained that he had thrown the stone to get the driver's attention because his injured brother, who could not walk, had fallen into danger and needed help. The driver's anger turned into understanding when he realized that the boy's action had a good intention behind it. The stone had damaged his car, but it had helped save a life."*

This story teaches us that we should not judge others without knowing the reason behind their actions, and that even unexpected actions can sometimes lead to something good. Stones are always thrown at us; it is left to us whether we make bridges or walls with them.

We are truly grateful to *Mrs. Eveline Sumana* for sharing *God's Word* and helping each one of us to strengthen our *Faith in Him*.

Educational Support - Financial Aid:

Our Women's Fellowship is supporting *two girls* for their education. They are *Sanmathi* of the ninth standard studying in Cluny Convent, a child of a single parent. We have paid ₹57,000/- towards her fees for the entire year. The mother and daughter have been attending St. Andrew's Church for the past three years.

Bhagyashree Venkatesh, a student of class 7, under the care of World Vision India, will also be supported by our Women Fellowship. The fees structure for this year will be sent to us shortly.

We are truly grateful to all the members of our Women's Fellowship for their support and generosity.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace and peace be unto you! We bring you encouraging updates from our *Mission Field* - of seeds sown, of a little flock being faithfully shepherded, and of a new mission taking shape. We trust that as you read, your hearts will be stirred to pray and give thanks alongside us.

Grace in Tubagere - A Congregation Nurtured in Faith

"Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." Matthew 28:19

Tucked away on the outskirts of Bangalore, the village of *Tubagere* is home to our active mission field - a quiet yet beautiful testimony to God's faithfulness. Here, a small but growing congregation of believers, mostly humble and hardworking village folk, gathers every Sunday to worship the Lord with joyful hearts. We thank our current Evangelist, *Mr. Praveen*, who has been faithfully nurturing the believers in faith and the Word of God. His dedication is a source of great encouragement to us all, and we continue to uphold him and the congregation in our prayers. Every Sunday, the congregation gathers on the rooftop terrace of the home of one of the believers - a humble makeshift tent that serves as their place of worship. It is a setting that reminds us vividly of the early church, where faith and fellowship flourished not in grand buildings, but in the hearts of devoted people.

A Blessed Visit from our Pastor:

We are delighted to share that our beloved Pastor, *Rev. Samuel B. Pujari*, along with members from St. Andrew's, visited the Tubagere congregation last Sunday. Pastor administered Holy Communion to the believers - a precious moment of grace and spiritual renewal for the congregation. The visit was followed by warm and joyful fellowship, where hearts were knit together in love and encouragement.

Pastoral Guidance and Prayer Focus:

Seeing the dedication of the congregation and their need, Pastor has encouraged the committee to arrange a better, more weather-resilient Tent so that Sunday worship can continue uninterrupted through all seasons. We are taking steps in this direction and covet your prayers as we plan ahead. Most significantly, Pastor has called the congregation - both in Tubagere and here at St. Andrew's - to pray earnestly for a site to be purchased so that a proper church building can be established in Tubagere. This remains a cherished hope and a matter of active prayer. While the path may seem long, we rest in the assurance that nothing is impossible with God, and we place this desire confidently before Him who is able to do exceedingly abundantly above all that we ask or think.

The congregation at Tubagere is being lovingly cared for - and we thank God for every step of this journey.

Missionary Work at Malur: A New Chapter Begins!

More than a year ago, God placed on our hearts a vision to reach the people of the Malur Area with the Gospel. And so, *Mission Malur* was born (earlier called *Project Andrew*) - named after the very place where God stirred this call within us. A Season of Transition to kickstart the mission work, we partnered with the *Indian Evangelical Mission (IEM)*, entrusting them with the initial groundwork of evangelism in the Malur area. For the past year, IEM worked diligently on our behalf, and we are grateful for their partnership and service during this season. After prayerful consideration, we have now mutually agreed to conclude our engagement with IEM. We thank them wholeheartedly for their work and commitment. This transition marks not an ending, but a new beginning - one where we take more direct ownership of *Mission Malur*, trusting God to open the right doors.

Exploring Partnership with Hoskote KCD Church:

As we look ahead, we are prayerfully evaluating a significant opportunity: to partner with the *KCD Church at Hoskote* - the nearest KCD congregation to the Malur area - to jointly launch and sustain *Mission Malur*. This collaboration, if it comes together, would bring together local church strength and our vision for evangelism in Malur in a meaningful way. We are in early conversations and covet your prayers as discernment unfolds. The mission's objective remains clear: to share the Gospel with the people of the Malur area through a dedicated Evangelist (to be identified in God's timing). We are trusting the Lord to bring forth the right person for this calling. *Mission Malur* is still in its prospecting stage - but it is a field of immense hope, and we invite you to be part of what God is about to do. We remain grateful to God for each one of you - your prayers and support make this work possible.

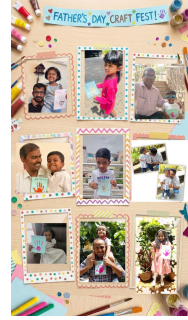

Work as Worship: Honouring God in our Professions

Colossians 3:23-24 (NIV) states, "Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters, since you know that you will receive an inheritance from the Lord as a reward. It is the Lord Christ you are serving."

God wants us to treat our jobs as an opportunity to serve and honor Him, rather than viewing work simply as a means to a paycheck. When Christ is the true audience of our work, everything changes. Integrity matters even when no one is watching. Excellence matters even when promotion never comes. Faithfulness matters even when work feels invisible. Work is worship.

In Genesis 24, Abraham's chief servant, Eliezer of Damascus, flawlessly executed his responsibility to find a bride for Isaac. Rather than taking credit, he credited God's providence throughout the journey and prayed for guidance before completing the task. His actions teach us to anchor our assignments in prayer, prepare diligently with the resources we have, and execute our duties with absolute integrity and selflessness.

Actionable Lessons for the Workplace

- Start with specific, purposeful **prayer**: When tasked with finding a wife for Isaac, Eliezer didn't rely on his own intellect. He asked God for distinct guidance. In your career, invite God into the specifics of your work and ask for wisdom when facing difficult decisions.
- **Prepare** thoroughly: Eliezer traveled with 10 camels laden with his master's best gifts to ensure he was fully equipped for the task. Honor God by doing the hard work of preparation—whether that means acquiring new skills or arriving at a meeting with complete, well-researched data.
- **Guard** your employer's interests: Eliezer cared more about Abraham's family mission than his own comfort, famously refusing to eat until his mission was clearly laid out and resolved. You can honor God in the workplace by treating your employer's resources, time, and reputation with the highest level of care.
- Maintain **humility**: Despite managing all of Abraham's wealth, Eliezer consistently referred to himself simply as "the servant of my master". Acknowledge that your talents and successes ultimately come from God and use them to serve your colleagues and clients.
- **Acknowledge** God's help: When Rebekah offered the exact sign he prayed for, Eliezer immediately bowed his head and worshiped the Lord. When you successfully complete tasks, quickly give God the glory and thank Him for the guidance.

Whether in an office, a classroom, at home, on the mission field or elsewhere, God has placed you there to be of use to Him, to bring Him glory. By doing your job excellently and with integrity, you have an impact on the people around you.
