"Go into all the world and proclaim the good news to the whole creation. Whoever believes and is baptised will be saved..." (St. Mark 16:15–16)

Reports of Activities by the Wings & Ministries

Care for the Elderly



We thank our Almighty God for blessing us with yet another Care for the Elderly fellowship, where we gathered to grow in our faith and experience His wonderful love and grace.

This month's speaker was **Rev. Dr. Allan S. Palanna**, who shared an inspiring message on the theme, **"Still Believing, Still Blessed."**

The meeting began with an opening prayer led by our Pastor, followed by a time of joyful praise and worship led by the Youth, as we lifted our hearts and voices in thanksgiving to God.

In his message, Rev. Dr. Palanna spoke about the challenges of living in an age of information overload. He reminded us that not everything we consume through media and technology reflects the truth. As believers, we are called to remain firmly rooted in God's Word rather than allowing our thoughts and perspectives to be shaped by the constant flow of information around us.

He challenged us to reflect on an important question: **What shapes our thinking our faith in God or the algorithms that increasingly influence our daily lives?** He observed that today's "new colonisers" are attention, data, emotions, habits, and screen time, all competing for our focus and affection.

He further explained that three kingdoms compete for the human heart:

- The Kingdom of God
- The Kingdom of Self
- The Kingdom of the Market

Everything we watch, read, and engage with strengthens one of these kingdoms. He also referred to Bob Dylan's well-known song, With God on Our Side, illustrating how easily people can assume God supports their own perspectives without seeking His truth.

Rev. Dr. Palanna encouraged us to remain steadfast in our faith by cultivating five spiritual necessities:

1. **Prayer** – faithfully praying for our children, grandchildren, and families.
2. **Discernment** – seeking God's wisdom to distinguish truth from falsehood.
3. **Community** – remaining connected to the fellowship of believers, where we encourage and strengthen one another.
4. **Scripture** – allowing God's Word to guide and transform our lives.
5. **Hope** – trusting in God's promises, regardless of life's circumstances.

He concluded by reminding us that we are called to resist the pressures of the world through faithful action and persistent prayer. As he beautifully expressed, **"Prayer is not about getting what we want, but about seeking God's will."** Let us continue to kneel before Him in faith, trusting His perfect plan for our lives.

The meeting concluded with a wonderful time of fellowship, as members enjoyed encouraging conversations and strengthened their bonds of Christian friendship.

Women's Fellowship

Greetings to you all in the precious name of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ.

The **Women's Fellowship of St. Andrew's Church** met online on **4th July 2026 at 3:30 p.m.** for our monthly Bible Study.

The session, titled "**Jesus Gives Hope**," focused on the life of **Mary Magdalene**. Together, we reflected on how God, in His boundless grace, gives us second, third, and countless opportunities to begin anew. We were reminded that none of us is defined by our worst moments, but by God's redeeming love and transforming grace.

Mary Magdalene's journey from being possessed by seven demons to becoming a devoted disciple of Jesus powerfully demonstrates the life-changing impact of encountering Christ. We reflected on how our own lives have been transformed since coming to know Him and considered how we respond to the many opportunities God graciously gives us.

Drawing from **Luke 8:1-3**, we studied how Mary, along with other women, faithfully supported Jesus' ministry. We discussed the contrast between her life before and after meeting Christ and reflected on how her story speaks into our own journey of faith.

From **John 19:17-25**, we were reminded of Mary's unwavering loyalty as she remained with Jesus through His suffering and crucifixion. Her faithfulness, recorded in all four Gospels, inspired us to reflect on those who have stood by us during difficult seasons. We shared personal experiences of God's love expressed through the loyalty and care of faithful friends.

The study encouraged us to remember that, just as Mary was transformed from rejection to acceptance, we too are made new in Christ. We reflected on the freedom we have experienced through His grace and discussed how we can extend that same grace to others by offering forgiveness, compassion, and second chances. We also examined our own faithfulness, asking ourselves what kind of friends we are and whether others can depend on us during life's challenges.

As we concluded the study, we spent time thanking God for rescuing us from our hurts, failures, and burdens, and for the freedom and healing we now enjoy in Christ. Inspired by Mary's grateful devotion, we discussed practical ways of expressing our gratitude to God through our words, actions, and service. We were also encouraged to show appreciation to those who have faithfully journeyed alongside us.

The session was a tremendous blessing, enriched by the heartfelt sharing of our sisters in Christ. We thank **Mrs. Kumuda Sujay** for prayerfully leading us through this meaningful Bible study. We pray that God will continue to bless and strengthen her ministry.

Looking ahead, the Women's Fellowship, together with the various wings of our church, is organising an **Ethnic Day** on **9th August 2026**. This event is being planned to bring together the entire St. Andrew's Church family on a common platform to celebrate our rich cultural diversity, strengthen our fellowship, and enjoy a joyful time together. Music Ministry

Celebrating the Gospel in Many Tongues Vernacular Music Evening 2026

"After this I looked, and there before me was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people and language, standing before the throne and before the Lamb." - Revelation 7:9

India's rich linguistic diversity is one of God's precious gifts. On Sunday, 26 July 2026, St. Andrew's Church celebrated this blessing through a unique Vernacular Music Evening, organised by the Church Music Ministry. Members of our congregation representing diverse linguistic backgrounds came together to worship God in their mother tongues, reminding us that while our languages may differ, our faith in Jesus Christ unites us as one family.



The evening commenced with the Kannada congregational hymn "**Intha Olle Samayadolu**," followed by the welcome address by **Mr. Vijay Kumar Palanna**, Secretary of the Pastorate Committee, the Scripture Reading, and sixteen musical presentations in ten different languages. The service concluded with the beloved Kannada hymn "**Kristyesu Swamee Vasisemmolu**" (Abide with Me) and the Benediction, bringing a memorable evening of worship to a fitting close.

The programme featured songs in **Gujarati, Hindi, Hebrew, Konkani, Malayalam, Marathi, Nepali, Tamil, Telugu, and Tulu**, each reflecting the beauty of its language while proclaiming the one unchanging Gospel of Jesus Christ. The Kannada congregational hymns beautifully wove the service together, enabling everyone present to participate wholeheartedly.

Among the many memorable highlights of the evening were:

- The **St. Andrew's Youth Fellowship**, whose energetic and inspiring presentations in **Hebrew** reflected both creativity and a willingness to explore beyond the familiar.
- The **St. Andrew's Church Choir**, which presented the original Malayalam composition "**Anudhinamenne Nadathidunna**," written by its senior member **Dr. E. Janifer**, and also rendered the treasured Tulu translation of "**Lead, Kindly Light**" (*Prakashha Kordu*) in its original tune, *Lux Benigna*.
- **Stuthi**, our Kannada choir, which rendered "**Aa Haa Haa Hallelujah**" in its original **Nepali**, under the guidance of **Mrs. Sharon Lepcha Singh** from Darjeeling. She later joined Stuthi in presenting a lively Tulu hymn, creating a beautiful exchange of languages, cultures, and Christian fellowship.
- **SAME (St. Andrew's Men's Ensemble)** was warmly welcomed as they ministered in church once again after a long interval with inspiring Tamil hymns, **which followed** an inspiring Tamil Medley rendered energetically by our own church talents, led by **Mr. Billy Graham**.

- A delightful blend of traditional hymns and contemporary worship songs presented by participants of all age groups from youth to senior members, beautifully reflecting both the diversity and unity of our congregation.

Each hymn carried a unique message of thanksgiving, hope, guidance, praise, dedication, salvation, and Christian living, affirming that God's truth speaks to every heart and every culture.

In his reflection, **Rev. Samuel B. Pujari** highlighted the biblical significance of languages. Referring to the account of Babel, he reminded the congregation that while languages once symbolised division, in Christ they become instruments of unity, worship, and the proclamation of the Gospel.

The blessings of the evening extended far beyond those gathered in church. The entire programme was streamed live on the Church's YouTube channel, and by July 29, just three **days later**, the recordings had already received nearly **2,500 views**, allowing this unique celebration of multilingual worship to reach and bless audiences well beyond Bengaluru.

As a church richly blessed with members from many parts of India, we thank God for this memorable evening. May He continue to use the rich heritage of our many languages and musical traditions to proclaim the Gospel, strengthen His Church, and draw many more people into the fellowship of His Kingdom.

THE FOUR GOSPELS: The Life and Teachings of Jesus Christ from four perspectives

The Gospel is the central story of the Bible. "Gospel" primarily refers to the foundational "Good News" of Christianity. The Gospel is about our God who found His way to us, rescuing us. It centers on the message of salvation through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ addressing how humanity can be reconciled with a Holy God. The term itself stems from the Old English *gōdspel* (meaning "good news"), which is a direct translation of the Greek word *evangelion*.

While they cover the same core narrative, each book was written by their authors-Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John-for a distinct audience, highlighting a unique aspect of Jesus' identity and mission.

Matthew (28 chapters): Written by a former tax collector and one of the twelve apostles, it was addressed to the Jewish audience to prove Jesus is the long-awaited *Messiah* who fulfills Old Testament prophecies. Matthew begins with Abraham, and traces the generations down to Jesus. It frequently draws parallels between Jesus and Moses, such as in the Sermon on the Mount. It records over 60 references to Old Testament prophecies.

Mark (16 chapters): Youngest of the group and a companion to Peter, Mark's short and fast-paced account records Peter's memories. and is directed at a Gentile (non-Jewish) audience. The Gospel of Mark begins with Jesus' baptism. It focuses heavily on Jesus' actions and miracles to present him as the "*Suffering Servant*" who came to sacrifice himself.

Luke (24 chapters): A physician and travel companion of Paul, Luke wrote a detailed, orderly historical narrative. Luke begins with the events surrounding Jesus' birth. Written to a broader Gentile audience, often emphasizing that Jesus is a compassionate *Savior* for all humanity, including the marginalized and the poor. It features a heavily historical narrative and includes iconic parables like the Prodigal Son.

John (21 chapters): Highly theological and distinct from the other three ("synoptic") gospels. This Gospel begins with the very first words of the Bible: "In the beginning". Rather than focusing on parables and a Galilee-centered ministry, John focuses on Jesus' ministry in Judea, using deep allegories to establish *Jesus as the divine, eternal Son of God*.

Where do we find our basis for beliefs on the Sacraments? Why do we baptize? Why do we receive the Lord's Supper? Why do we forgive? How do we pray? Why is it important for us to serve others? The answers to these questions are found within the Gospels.

By studying the depth of what Jesus said and did during His life on earth, we dig into the theology behind many of our church's customs and practices. Through the perfect and blameless example Jesus set for us, we know how we must live our lives.
