"When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth; for he will not speak on his own, but will speak whatever he hears, and he will declare to you the things that are to come." (St. John 16:13)

We live in an age where Artificial Intelligence and rapidly advancing technology are transforming the way we learn and teach. In the years ahead, AI may play an increasingly significant role in schools, colleges, and other learning environments. Yet, even as technology changes teaching methods, the importance of a true teacher remains.

Our learning does not happen only within classrooms. At home, our parents are our first teachers. In life, guardians, elders, mentors, and those around us continue to guide and shape us. But beyond all these influences, there is one Teacher whose guidance is essential to our spiritual life: the **Holy Spirit**.

Jesus reminds us in John 16:13:

Women's Fellowship

Greeting to you in the precious name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ!

Our Bible Study was conducted *online* on *Saturday* the *1st* of *August* by *Mrs. Vineetha Sunita*, and the topic was on *"Taming Our Tongue"* from the *Letter of James 3:1-12*. We looked at and reflected on this passage, which *Mrs. Vineetha* simply but powerfully put forth as follows:

"The Power of Our Words: Words are among God's greatest gifts to us. They have the power to encourage the weary, comfort the grieving, strengthen relationships, and proclaim the hope of the Gospel. Yet the same words, when spoken carelessly, can wound hearts, damage relationships, and leave lasting scars. In James 3:1-12, James reminds believers that the tongue, though small, carries extraordinary power.

Using familiar illustrations - a bit that guides a horse, a rudder that steers a large ship, and a tiny spark that can set an entire forest ablaze - James teaches that our speech has the ability to direct the course of our lives and influence those around us. Though the tongue is one of the smallest parts of the body, it often reveals the true condition of our hearts.

We all agreed that this message is especially relevant in our world today. Conversations no longer take place only face-to-face; our words travel instantly through text messages, emails, and social media. A single careless comment can spread rapidly, causing misunderstanding, division, and hurt. Equally, one word of kindness, encouragement, or forgiveness can bring healing, restore hope, and point someone towards Christ.

James begins by reminding those who teach that they carry a greater responsibility because of their influence. While this applies directly to those who teach God's Word, it also serves as a reminder that every believer influences others. Whether we are parents, grandparents, spouses, friends, colleagues, ministry leaders, or simply members of the body of Christ, people are watching our lives and listening to our words. We have the privilege - and responsibility - of using our speech to build others up.

Perhaps the most sobering part of the passage is James' observation that with the same tongue we praise God and yet sometimes speak harshly to those created in His image. A heart transformed by Christ should increasingly produce words marked by grace, truth, patience, and love.



James also acknowledges that taming the tongue is one of life's greatest challenges. Left to ourselves, we often speak impulsively when we are tired, frustrated, or hurt. This reminds us that controlling our speech is not simply about developing better habits; it is evidence of God's transforming work within us. As we grow in our relationship with Christ, the Holy Spirit shapes not only our actions but also our conversations.

How then can we guard our speech? Scripture encourages us to be "quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry" (James 1:19). Pausing before responding, listening with compassion, praying for wisdom, and allowing God's Word to fill our hearts are practical ways to ensure that our words honour Him.

Our church is called to be a community where words bring life. May our conversations encourage the discouraged, strengthen the weak, reconcile the broken, and glorify God. As we reflected on James 3:1-12, our prayer is that our speech will consistently reflect the love of Christ."

"Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in Your sight, O Lord, my Rock and my Redeemer." Psalm 19:14

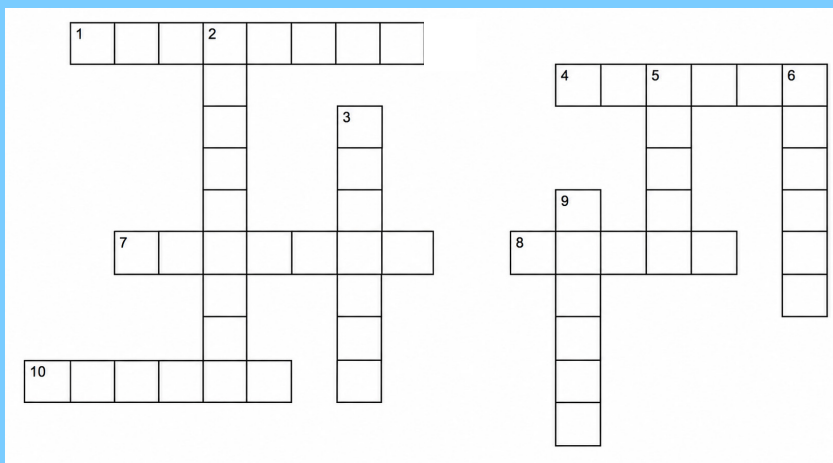


SEEKERS NOOK

LOIS AND EUNICE

Timothy was one of the apostle Paul's closest co-workers whom he commissioned to stay on in the city of Ephesus and to help establish a strong church there (1 Timothy 1:3). Paul recognized and honoured the life-changing contributions of his mother Eunice, and his grandmother, Lois, in a day when women were rarely mentioned by name.

Timothy's mother, Eunice, was 'a Jewish woman who was a believer', while Timothy's father was Greek (Acts 16:1). However, in the midst of this mixed-race and mixed-faith household, she shines as a faithful example. In 2 Timothy 1:5, we learn that Timothy's faith came from years of influence and his upbringing by his godly mother, Eunice, and his grandmother, Lois. *'I am reminded of your sincere faith, which first lived in your grandmother Lois and in your mother Eunice and, I am persuaded, now lives in you also. For this reason, I remind you to fan into flame the gift of God, which is in you through the laying on of my hands. For God did not give us a spirit of timidity, but one of power, love and self-discipline'* (2 Timothy 1:5-7).

What a blessing to pass on! The Scriptures proclaim faith that rests in Christ Jesus. Eunice and Lois knew that they had a responsibility to train Timothy in the Scriptures and ensured that he had *the truth* embedded into his way of thinking. We wouldn't find two books of the New Testament bearing Timothy's name had they not gone about that work with diligence. They are examples of the powerful influence parents and grandparents can have on a young person's life. It is a reminder that the Lord uses us all. There are younger generations around us whom we can influence. The greatest legacy we can leave is to continually point others to Jesus by living out our personal faith, sharing Scriptures and testimonies of God's faithfulness.

They traveled to many different cities together to build churches and help people love God. Paul eventually sent Timothy to lead a big church in a city called Ephesus. Paul wrote letters (1 & 2 Timothy) to encourage him, saying: "Don't let anyone look down on you because you are young, but set an example for the believers in speech, in conduct, in love, in faith and in purity" (1 Timothy 4:12).
